



## KLVH Report to KLPC Annual Meeting May 2022

Following two years of disrupted functioning due to the Covid pandemic, we have seen the hall gradually returning to near 'normal' use.

Until July 2021 face masks had to be worn in the hall. Social events could not take place in the hall until the middle of July and numbers in the hall were initially restricted to 50. Test and Trace continued until mid-August so careful records had to be kept. Numbers permitted in the hall did not increase until October when 80 people were allowed in. In December face masks again became compulsory for hall users until legislation allowed near the end of January.

Our regular users have gradually returned and we currently have 21 regular hall users and 7 regular users for the Committee Room. We were sorry to lose 'Create Move Dance' as they have ceased their operations following lockdown.

Since May last year the hall has been booked on 636 occasions and the committee room on 111 occasions.

In July our Annual General Meeting took place in the hall and 9 members of the public attended.

We have seen a high demand for children's parties since we re-opened. There had been many disappointed children over the past two years as their parties were cancelled.

Rural Arts Touring events have not yet re-started but we were able to hold an outdoor performance of 'King Arthur' last July. We were blessed with the hottest day of the year, fortunately we were able to seat the audience in the shade,

Financially, the end of FY21 found us in a robust and secure position. This was primarily due to the substantial level of government support grants.

Our Annual General Meeting will take place in the hall on Wednesday 27<sup>th</sup> July. All are welcome.
